CLINICAL CONTEXT:
Admitted after #NOF in rehome. Two faxed referrals arrived at once and were mis-stapled together off the fax machine. Patient received multiple meds from other patient including M-Elson 200mg. Spent considerable time in ICU.

CHART REVIEW ISSUES:		
Issue: Requires committee review re: morphine overdose; it appears the morphine was prescribed for this patient, hence root cause likely to be Rx error.	Outcome: Notes for another patient mixed up when faxed from GP; other meds also prescribed for this patient incorrectly - e.g. Metformin, Quinapril, Aspirin.
